

Emergency Grants are available from the Foundation for all Districts impacted as initial support and we will administer the funds received from the Appeal direct with the Districts.





Paralowie Lions and Rotary working together Don't throw away those ring pulls

The humble ring pull,... pull it once and just become scrap along with the rest of the can.

Pull it off and place it in a container and its on its way to provide a prosthetic limb to one of Asia's many landmine victims.

Indiscriminate laying of mines during the many years of turmoil in Thailand, Cambodia, Laos and Viet Nam, have turn vast areas of agricultural land into killing and maiming grounds, claiming hundreds of victims each year. Survivors of the blasts will often lose one or both of their legs. The foundation gives these victims a second chance in life by providing them with the prostheses free of charge. A mobile unit goes out into the regional areas to get those who have no way of getting into the foundations headquarters.

The ring pulls also help finance three orphanages two in Viet Nam and one in Cambodia run by Viet Nam Vets in

The ring pulls are sent to a scrap metal facility and weighed, the money raised go to the projects mentioned. 2500 ring pulls provide approximately 1 kg of aluminium and 1kg of aluminium can provide 7 sets of ioints for prostheses.

Rotary have been collecting well over 15 tones. of ring pulls for the past 10 years. . It is a great project for much needed cause, we are proud to be a part of this project.

Get you whole community involved, schools, aged care facilities, hotels, sporting clubs, your lions club and individuals. The Lions Club of Paralowie would gladly receive them.
