





The Carols draws a crowd of around 5,000 people and the Carols committee donate around \$4,000- to local charities from proceeds of the evening. Our Club still found time to enjoy a Christmas Dinner at Roopena Football Club with members and volunteers that have helped during the year.

We set up our catering van in Ada Ryan Gardens for the Australia Day Celebrations and donated the profits to 2

young Whyalla girls that have been chosen in the South Australian

Calisthenics team to compete in the National Titles in Perth in June.

March saw the Club roll up their sleeves and attend our annual Clean Up Australia Day event on Arthur Glennie Drive. We do this together with the youth from the Whyalla Scout Group and Whyalla Girls Guides. There was 48 people attended and we managed to fill the Hippo Bin in just over the hour. Lions Club provided participants with free drinks following the event.

The local hospital is in desperate need of a phone back up service when the power goes out. They have generators for the normal power supply, but when it goes down, the town phones, including mobiles do also. The cost -\$3,500. The motion was put, seconded and carried unamiously within a few minutes. I'm sure that the members won't mind me saying, but this donation represented about a third of their Activities Account balance. A great sign of a Club with great purpose. So often I've seen Clubs form sub-committees to consider such donations and by the time a decision is made, the need is all but over.

Crystal Brook Club Branch

Many Lions Clubs are very good at either service work or fundraising and it's rare to find one that does both very successfully. 

INTERESTING STORY ABOUT THE SS WARRIMOO



The passenger steamer SS Warrimoo was quietly knifing its way through the waters of the mid-Pacific on its way from Vancouver to Australia. The navigator had just finished working out a star fix and brought the master, Captain John Phillips, the result. The Warrimoo's position was latitude 0 degrees x 31 minutes north and longitude 179 degrees x 30 minutes West.

The date was 30 December 1899. Know what this means? First Mate Payton broke in, we're only a few miles from the intersection of the Equator and the International Date Line.

Captain Phillips was prankish enough to take full advantage of the opportunity for achieving the navigational freak of a lifetime. He called his navigators to the bridge to check and double check the ships position. He changed course slightly so as to bear directly on his mark. Then he adjusted the engine speed. The calm weather and clear night worked in his favour. At midnight the Warrimoo lay on the Equator at exactly the point where it crossed the International Date Line!

The consequences of this bizarre position were many.

- 1. The forward part of the ship was in the Southern Hemisphere and the middle of summer.
- 2.The stern was in the Northern Hemisphere and in the middle of winter.
- 3.The date in the aft part of the ship was 31 December 1899.
- 4. Forward it was 1 January 1900.

This ship was therefore not only in two different days, two different months, two different seasons and two different years but in two different centuries-all at the same time.



Thank you to Vice President Beau Brug for sponsoring her induction and special guest incoming District Governor Kevin Masters for conducting the induction.



Article 4 of 5 Goals & Objectives in PR Campaigns



Public relations is a valuable area of marketing for small businesses that should try to get as much unpaid for media exposure as possible. Public relations are messages delivered by companies that do not cost to place. This distinguishes PR from advertising, which is paid-for communication through media. Several common goals exist for PR.

Promote Goodwill

One of the simplest and most straight-forward objectives of PR campaigns is to enhance your company's goodwill with its market. Goodwill means a gen-

erally positive rapport with the communities in which you do business. Having this strong connection helps drive customers to your business and also aids in building long-term loyal relationships with key customers. Getting involved in community activities and participating in charitable programs are common techniques to promote goodwill with the community.

Raise Awareness

Another common PR campaign objective is to raise awareness of your brand and products. This can coincide with advertising campaigns with similar objectives. Raising awareness is an important step for new companies or businesses that have not yet established strong recognition in the marketplace. Newspaper articles, featured news stories and participation in community events can all help boost the recognition of a brand within the marketplace.

Change Attitudes

Sometimes referred to as attitudinal change objectives, PR campaigns can have a purpose of improving or reshaping customer attitudes about your brand. Companies that struggle with negative perceptions in the market often use public relations to promote a message of community involvement, charitable giving or product benefits for the common good. Public relations can sometimes serve better with this objective because when a company pays to build its image, audiences understand the message and it is less subtle than some PR efforts.

Inform

Though information PR objective often coincide with more direct business benefits, many PR efforts have a direct goal of informing audiences. For instance, a consulting company may send out weekly email newsletters to offer free advice to businesses. The hope is that regularly staying in front of customers with messages that are useful will help you maintain top-of-mind awareness. In addition, providing free and useful information can generate positive sentiments from the market.
