




WOW what a way to start a new year in LIONS. Jeanette and I have just returned from the International Lions Convention in Las Vegas, where Gudrun Yngvadottir was elected as the first Female International President and, also the first Lion from Iceland to become International President.

During the final plenary session of the Convention, Gudrun was sworn in as International President together with the 740 District Governors - Elect from around the world, who were then inducted as District Governors, by the new President.

4,319 delegates attended the convention and our name tags had a chip implanted which gave us access to our meals and access to venues. Security was very high as President George W Bush was one of the keynote speakers.



Lion Clubs International Fund (LCIF) Campaign 100 was launched at the Convention to raise US\$100million a year for three years, to provide funding for LCIF to support the five global causes adopted by Lions, being Childhood Cancer, Hunger, Environment, Diabetes and Vision. LCIF also provides support to clubs in Emergencies and disasters such as Cyclones, floods and bushfires at home and also around the world. What a sensational Convention although very HOT on a daily basis with temps hovering around 110 deg F.

At home, IPDG Megan had a wonderful night celebrating her year as District Governor with more than 140 Lions, family and friends, the most we have seen for many years at a District Handover.

IPDG Meg gave several awards including the International Presidents Medal to Lion Pat Williams, well done Pat.

Of course another highlight of the night was a BIG CHEQUE for more than \$6500 to Geoff Thomas and Jerry Packer from Motor Neurone Disease Association of South Australia.

Unfortunately a clash of events meant that we at District C1 were unable to attend the Multiple District GAT, GMT, GLT, GST get together in Melbourne on the same night as our Handover.

So our good friend PDG Ann Eldridge who is the MD 201 GMT Area Coordinator offered to come to Adelaide on Saturday 28th July to give those who missed out the low down on what the weekend was all about. About 20 members attended gained some valuable tips from The Global Action Team.




