



HAVING TROUBLE WITH MyLCI

Message from John Barnes (Admin & Club Support)

Sorry about all these emails, but all I know is there are many of you who have difficulty trying (and some have given up trying) to register your new Universal Password. Please pass this information on to your members

In attempting to help members register, I'm gradually learning ... yes, I know – surprising isn't it?

HINTS/CORRECTION/PREREQUISITES

1. You need to enter both your email and phone number when initially registering using a computor! I thought it was either.

a. Email must be the same as recorded in MyLCI

Phone must be entered by:

Ensuring AUSTRALIA is selected as the country

Enter your number as per normal, but drop the initial zero, i.e. mine is 0448 895 170 so enter 448 895 170 (no spaces, obviously – 448895170)

2. Your D.O.B. must be the same as is recorded in MyLCI that is it must now include the month/day/year. If you have not been diligent in entering your member's D.O.B. during the January Members Details Update process, you will find your members' D.O.B. recorded as 01/1/yyyy where "yyyy" is the year of birth. In this instance, if you enter your correct D.O.B. it can be assumed an error will be generated.

Because you now do not have access, email me your D.O.B. and I shall enter it for you. You can then hopefully access MyLCI and fix your members' entries.

3. Although this is also inconsistent (my password is all lowercase with a number because of the way I registered), *your password should be at least 6 characters, include an uppercase letter, a lowercase letter, and a number.* It tells you what is required below where the password is to be entered.

4. Don't forget to scroll you webpage down so you do not miss further instructions such as checking the agreeing to privacy policy and conditions of use. Many have got to the second re-enter password field and put the password in, hit enter and waited. And waited – not knowing there were the other items to action of screen at the bottom.

5. And of course – the 'CONTINUE' button.

6. If you have a break through and succeed in registering, if you can remember how you did it please let me know so I can pass the 'trick' on.

FROM WHYALLA MT LAURA CLUB—COLD CAP MACHINE

A \$45,000 cold cap machine which can reduce hair loss during chemotherapy by up to 85 per cent has been purchased for the Whyalla Hospital thanks to the fundraising efforts of volunteers in the community.

The Paxman Cooling System, now located in the hospital's Cancer Resource Centre, features a small refrigeration unit that circulates a coolant at minus four degrees Celsius through to a specially designed cap.

Patients wear this 'cold cap' which slows down the blood flow to the scalp and decreases the amount of hair loss chemotherapy drugs cause. It's a twin system, so two patients can use the machine at the same time.

Consulting Oncologist Professor Sankha Mitra said losing hair was a very big issue for female cancer patients because they lose their anonymi

"There are also issues of body image and maintaining a positive outlook while undergoing intensive chemotherapy," she said.

"There have been patients in the past who have had to go to Adelaide for the cold cap treatment. The whole aim was to get cancer treatment as close to patients' home as possible. "Having the cold cap machine here is a big advantage because Whyalla is the regional cancer centre."

The Whyalla Pink Spirits contributed \$20,000 to the system, with part of those funds raised by chemotherapy patient Sharon Powell, who organised a <u>fundraiser earlier</u> this year with her daughter-in-law Chloe Coles. Ms Powell, who lost her hair during chemotherapy, said it was a big win for female patients to hold on to some of their hair while undergoing treatment."Now we have our machine it will be interesting to see how it really works," she said.

Ms Coles said she was 'very excited' to hear the machine was coming to Whyalla after their hard work raising funds. Pink Spirits President Raelene Williams said she had met many women who had lost their hair during cancer treatment through her support group.

"A product like this is what your sausage money goes to," he said. It's something that affects ladies more than anything else because it's so visual. If this machine does what it is meant to do, it will be really beneficial for the people who use it," she said.

The Whyalla Ladies Auxiliary (\$10,000), Mount Laura Lions Club (\$3000) and the Lions Club of Whyalla (\$2000) also chipped in to secure the machine for Whyalla.

Mt Laura Lions Club Past President Brian Marshall said the purchase was proof that funds raised by their sausage sizzles went to something valuable.

CANDIDATES FOR THE OFFICE OF INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR 2020-2022

The Multiple District Convention to be held in Adelaide in 2020 will consider candidates for the office of International Director to represent Constitutional Area 7 for the term 2020 -2022. Intending candidates should refer to clauses 85-93 of the Multiple District Constitution and By-Laws.

In particular please note:

85. Subject to the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws, any member of a Lions Club seeking the endorsement of the Conventions of his/her District and of the Multiple District as a candidate for the office of International Director and/or International Second Vice-President shall:-

85.1 Deliver (by mail or in person) written Notice of Intention to seek such endorsement to the Cabinet Secretary of such District (in the case of a proposed District Convention endorsement) and to the Executive Officer (in the case of a proposed Multiple District Convention endorsement) no less than 60 days prior to the convening date of the relevant Convention at which such question of endorsement is to be considered.

85.2 Deliver with the said Notice of Intention evidence of fulfilment of qualifications for such office as set forth in the International Constitution and By-Laws.

CASH FOR PORT PIRIE'S LIBERTY SWING

Motorcyclists from across the state gathered in Gladstone to raise funds for the Lions Club of Port Pirie's Liberty Swing project for the Mid North Education Centre.

About 60 motorcyclists from seven clubs spent a night at the Gladstone Gaol, enjoying themselves and dropping as much cash as they could.

Over the night, \$1,600 was able to be fundraised towards the \$40,000 swing which from community help and hard work was more than half-way to being bought.

Trevor 'Grump' Muggleton led the idea of the fundraising and explained that motorcyclists complete many charity runs over a year and after seeing the recent fundraising completed by the Flinders Touring Motorcycle Association, he too wanted to help.

"I spoke to the fellas in concern and from there we put this up. It took about six weeks to do it, 60 people had a good time, we left about \$1,600 behind and now we hope we can do some more for the Lions club.

"People sold up, we sold our raffle tickets, we had a barbecue tea, everybody had a really good night. We had a live DJ from Adelaide up here, lighting effects. Everybody sat back and had a really good night," Mr Muggleton explained.

The money raised on the night was in collaboration with the Lions Club of Port Pirie, whose president Laureen Hardiman had set that as her fundraising project.

Her vice president, Michael Baldock, explained that they have been working on fundraising for the swing over the past 12 months.

"We had the prostate group in Port Pirie donate \$8,000, the Australian Lions Foundation have done \$10,000 and these guys here have fundraised just over \$1,600, so that is great," Mr Baldock said.

The Lions Club of Port Pirie were very grateful for the motorcyclists who came together, raising a significant sum in only one night.

"It is fantastic. It is really heartening to see these guys put together something, have a bit of a show and raise some money for something worthwhile," Mr Baldock explained.



TOP HONOUR: Lions Club of Port Pirie member Carlene King OAM was inducted into the Australian Lions Foundation Hall of Fame.

Three decades as a Lion has taken Carlene King OAM around Australia and the world, now her extensive work with the service organisation has been given a high honour after being inducted into the Australian Lions Foundation Hall of Fame.

She is the second Port Pirie Lion to be bestowed the honour, following the induction of club treasurer and past district governor Lance Leak OAM.

The Australian Lions Foundation plays an essential role for the service organisation in Australia and consistently supports clubs in delivering community projects. At a state and national level, it has delivered help when it is needed most, from the devastation of Cyclone Tracey in 1974 to helping drought-affected farmers and communities.

Speaking of her local club, she said it was very community focused and described it is as a successful club in the community.

"They have completed some wonderful projects," she said.

Her involvements with Lions over the years have meant she has met people all over the world.

She has provided training for Lions at both a national and international level and also served as national manager for youth and community projects for 12 years.

"I have given to Lions but I have received back ten-fold," she said.

"It has given me such wonderful opportunities and experiences in my lifetime that I wouldn't have otherwise been given."

One of the things that impressed her the most about the organisation, and still impresses her today, is that every dollar raised from the public is used on projects.

"The strength of Lions is that they're the biggest service club organisation in the world," she said.

"When they're called on to do big things, they always deliver.

"When big things happen in the world, Lions are always among the first on the scene."


