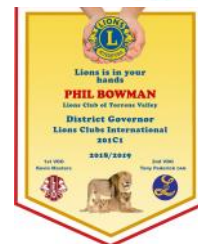

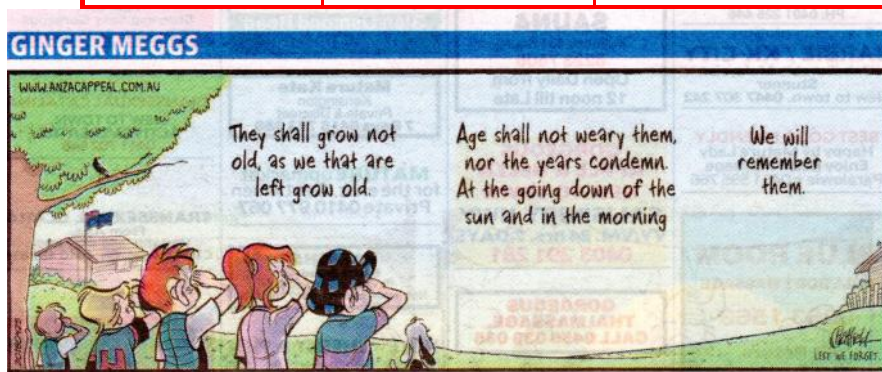

HAVING TROUBLE WITH MyLCI

Message from John Barnes (Admin & Club Support)

Sorry about all these emails, but all I know is there are many of you who have difficulty trying (and some have given up trying) to register your new Universal Password. Please pass this information on to your members

In attempting to help members register, I'm gradually learning ... yes, I know – surprising isn't it?

HINTS/CORRECTION/PREREQUISITES

1. You need to enter both your email and phone number when initially registering using a computer! I thought it was either.

a. Email must be the same as recorded in MyLCI

Phone must be entered by:

Ensuring AUSTRALIA is selected as the country

Enter your number as per normal, but drop the initial zero, i.e. mine is 0448 895 170 so enter 448 895 170 (no spaces, obviously – 448895170)

2. Your D.O.B. must be the same as is recorded in MyLCI that is it must now include the month/day/year. **If you have not been diligent in entering your member's D.O.B. during the January Members Details Update process, you will find your members' D.O.B. recorded as 01/1/yyyy where "yyyy" is the year of birth.** In this instance, if you enter your correct D.O.B. it can be assumed an error will be generated.

Because you now do not have access, email me your D.O.B. and I shall enter it for you. You can then hopefully access MyLCI and fix your members' entries.

3. Although this is also inconsistent (my password is all lowercase with a number because of the way I registered), *your password should be at least 6 characters, include an uppercase letter, a lowercase letter, and a number.* It tells you what is required below where the password is to be entered.

4. Don't forget to scroll you webpage down so you do not miss further instructions such as checking the agreeing to privacy policy and conditions of use. Many have got to the second re-enter password field and put the password in, hit enter and waited. And waited – not knowing there were the other items to action of screen at the bottom.

5. And of course – the 'CONTINUE' button.

6. If you have a break through and succeed in registering, if you can remember how you did it please let me know so I can pass the 'trick' on.

Dear President and Members,

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your support and bring you up to date with what we've been doing.

Just over 12 months ago when we started working on the drought, little did we dream we'd be still hard at it a year later, let alone having reached so many farmers with so many still to go.

Since the start of last year we have serviced farms in Victoria, New South Wales, Queensland and South Australia for the drought, as well as dealing with several Victorian fires and the North Queensland floods.

A total of nearly 2500 farmers helped in the last year!!! (Please see attached map)

These deliveries have been done with just about 700 truck and trailer loads, carrying about 25,000 large square or round bales, and other stock feed, transported from all 6 States, worth around \$6,000,000.

All achieved by a project managed by Lions volunteers, no wages, and on a shoestring budget.

Some other standout moments and highlights from the last 12 months :-

July :- Channel 7 Sunrise program broadcast live from Pakenham featuring Need for Feed. Front page story in Sydney Sunday Telegraph. Need for Feed saved a farmer from shooting his 1200 sheep.

August :- First convoy of hay arrives from Tasmania. Featured on Channel Seven National News. We continued bring in 2 trucks from Tassie each week for several months, all donated. Need for Feed invited by the National Farmers Federation to a Drought Charities Conference in Canberra.

Need for Feed announced as the first recipient of the Channel 9 Today Show / Rotary fundraising. We were granted \$500,000. We were able to go back for a second grant in November.

September :- Invited to Drought Charities Conference in Dubbo with the NSW Drought Coordinator and Department of Primary Industry.

Fathers Day Convoys to NSW, Our biggest yet, 90 trucks from 4 States, 4,000 bales delivered.

Need for Feed featured on ABC Landline.

We were also invited to Brisbane to meet with the new Federal Drought Coordinator, Major General Stephen Day.

We are now a permanent part of the Joint Agencies Drought Task Force, overseen by the Prime Ministers Department, with input into policy.

Second Convoy to East Gippsland and Wellington Shires, 35 plus trucks with great support from local Clubs.

Our first convoy of hay from Western Australia, compliments of Yogi from Outback Truckers

October :- Invited to speak at the National Farmers Federation Congress in Canberra.

November :- Invited to do a presentation at N3 Lions District Convention. We were presented with cheques in excess of \$100,000, in recognition of our ongoing work in the area.

December :- Lions and Need for Feed were front and centre for the filming of Channel 10's Master Chef outdoor service challenge at Briagolong. The episode will go to air in May.

With the help of our District, our paperwork was submitted to have Need for Feed considered as a Category B Project at the Multiple District Convention at Geelong in May this year. We hope your Club will consider supporting us in this endeavour.

January :- In the first week we took our first hay run to South Australia's drought affected farmers.

The Australia Day weekend saw us conduct 2 hay runs, one to NSW by 15 Victorian trucks to meet up with 47 road trains from Farmers Across Borders of Western Australia, the largest convoy ever from West to East. The hay was distributed to about 300 farmers spread over 200,000 square kilometres in the north west of the state and some into south west Queensland. At the same time, we also had another 15 or so trucks take hay to recipients in East Gippsland.

February :- Early in month our volunteers responded to requests for help with the North Queensland floods, taking 4 road trains from Northern Victoria as far north as they could before being stopped by the flood waters between Cloncurry and Normanton. Our hay was ferried in by helicopter to where it was needed from there. Our drivers were hosted by Lions Clubs along the way, with both Q2 and Q4 Districts also contributing to the fuel bill.

March :- On the Victorian Labour Day weekend we again had 2 hay runs, one to Northern Vic and Southern NSW, and other deliveries to the Gippsland Fires.

As you can see it has been an extremely busy time for our volunteers and with no end in sight to this drought just yet there is much more still to do.

It's been the support from Club's like yours, and of course the Australian Public, that has kept us going, and it's your support that will keep us going.

Your ongoing support will mean so much to so many who are still suffering.

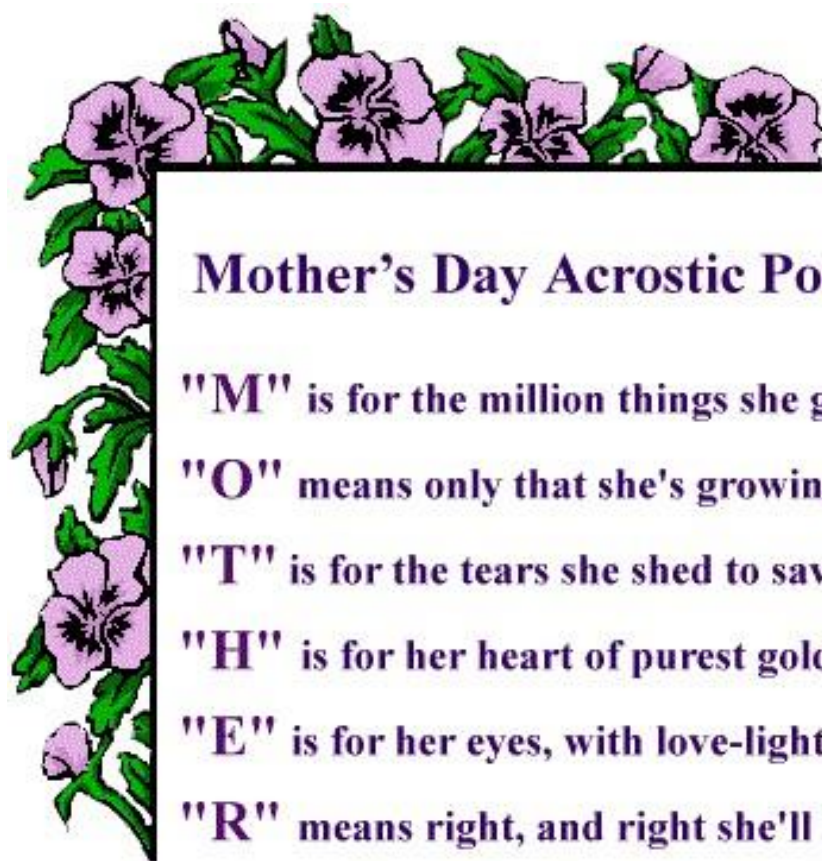

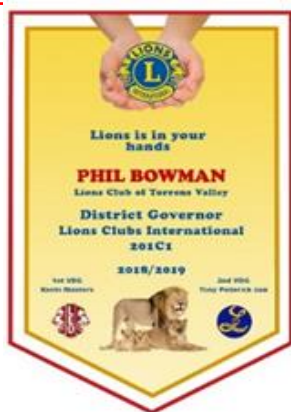
CLUB LEADERSHIP FORUM ELIZABETH

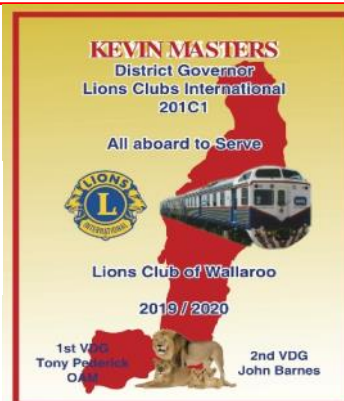
