I have known Graeme since about 1973 when he was on the local kindergarten committee and have remained friends and a neighbour ever since. I was only too happy to support his nomination for an award because over the past 45 years I have got to know so much about Graeme and the time he spends helping the community especially through a number of Lions Club International Foundations and Activities. He convinced me to join Lions and has supported me in both club and district leadership roles.

Graeme has held positions in the Golden Grove Lions Club including as President, Secretary and Treasurer for more than 10 years. As well as his roles within the club he was involved in the district Lions as a Zone Chairman for 7 years, Youth of the Year and of course Lions Districts 201C1 and C2 Medical Research Foundation. His work as treasurer has been long and outstanding according to a Past District Governor. He told me that without Graeme's guidance, the Foundation would not have been as well off as it might.

Graeme has worked or promoted other Lions Foundations and District Projects such as Lions Cord Blood Foundation, Lions Districts 201C1 and C2 Mobile Skin Cancer Screening Unit and Lions Health Screening at District level. Graeme has not been content to just accept leadership roles such as treasurer or coordinator but actively promotes these Foundations and Projects. Further, he has only been too willing to meet with others outside the



Lions organisation and work with them if he thought that they would be able to give extra support.

While Graeme usually plays a leading part in the promotion and organisation of these health activities, he is also prepared to do any of the spade work when the activities are in operation. He organises volunteers and ensures that they are supported during the day as they work with the public. Over the years he has convinced doctors and nurses to work with the Lions promoting so many of these great Health projects.

In recent years I have attended a number of conventions including District, Multiple District and even an ANZI Forum .At these meetings it became clear that Graeme is recognised by many outside of the local area for his outstanding contribution to the Lions health foundations and Projects. He has been recognised with many Lions awards and a Melvin Jones Fellowship, the highest award in the Lions Clubs International. Graeme is a Life Member of Lions Clubs International. Lions have discreetly asked me if there is any award that he has not been presented with as they are at a loss to think of something for further recognition. This, I think is the real reason for considering him for an award within the Order of Australia. He has done so much, Lions are at a loss to honour him further but think he deserves to be.

Golden Grove Lions have been working with the City of Tea Tree Gully Council for a number of years. The liaison with the council officers has often been Graeme and the list of these activities is impressive. They have included the dog park shelter and Lions Bicentennial Rotunda, use of facilities for the District Convention and catering for Tree Planting Day, Touch a Truck, Australia Day celebrations and citizenship ceremonies.

I did ask Graeme what he got personally from all of these years working with the Lions Medical Research Foundation and he told me that it was the opportunity of working with other people that he may not have ever met. "They are such an interesting bunch of people", he said.

This is why I whole heartedly supported Graeme for this award.

BOOKMARKS - World Sight Day 10th October 2019 This is being promoted by LEHP. The basic aim is for clubs to purchase quantities of magnifying book marks from LEHP at \$50 for 100 and to then donate these to a local library where librarians can give a book mark away to each child checking out a book during the month of October. Book marks will carry the message "as a rule, test young eyes before starting school"

Each book mark will be accompanied by a LEHP brochure reminding parents of the importance of having their children's eyes assessed.

SCREENING PROGRAM

The bookmark program leads into another wonderful LEHP project whereby clubs can get involved with a childs eye screening program at local kindergartens or primary schools. This requires a minimal number of members and can be achieved for very low costs.

Those members who get involved will need some basic training which either I or Lion Rob Winter, Noarlunga Morphett Vale Lions Club, can provide details of.

This project provides clubs with a great opportunity to deliver a wonderful community service as well as PR for Lions which in turn provides an ideal scenario to combine with a membership drive in an attempt to recruit new members.

NEWS FROM ANGLE VALE CLUB

WE HAVE LIFT OFF TO ZIMBABWE

Angle Vale Lions are happy to say we are finishing loading our 40' container with medical and education aid ready to ship to Zimbabwe.

We would like to acknowledge the donations made to this project by Lions Clubs of Gawler, Unley, Rocky River and Glenside also the clubs that donated aid.

With the help of Angle Vale and the local community in our area we collected over 150 boxes of aid, clothing and school supplies.

Rotary Donations In Kind Edinburgh where we have been loading the container donated hospital equipment such as beds, dental chairs, patient lifter, scales and many boxes of consumables along with school desks, chairs, white boards and stationary. Rotary have also been a great source of advice and our thanks go out to them.

This project has taken quite a while to come to completion as we had to raise \$20,000 to pay for the container, shipping and internal transport in Zimbabwe.

The container is going to the district of Buhera and will be distributed to the Murambinda Hospital and the Mumbijo Primary School. The container then will remain at the school for storage.

My personal thanks go out to past and present members of the Angle Vale Lions Club for the fantastic effort you have all contributed to for this project, we certainly cooked a lot of snags, we also had a Bingo Night run by the Elizabeth Masons Lodge, a Movie Night at Gawler Cinemas and our Car Boot/Craft Market at Vigara Winery and our thanks go to these organisations and the many businesses who donated to raffle prizes

We now wait for final custom clearance from Zimbabwe in relation to import duties etc and a shipping

AUSTRALIAN LIONS HEARING DOGS.

Much needed expansion to current premises at Verdun in South Australia.

This is the exciting news released at MD Convention at Geelong early in May, and below are the Artists images of the planned expansion showing the enlargement and renovation of the existing administration building and the overall extensions to Training areas, state-of-the-art Kennel complex to house 50 dogs and two purpose built training houses.



Alterations will be completed in four stages to allow the staff to continue working, training and delivering dogs with minimum disruption to routine. Stage one - the Administration Building expected to commence in 2021 – and total project completion five years from that date.

The Lions Clubs of Australia will not be asked to fund this building project, we are sourcing Corporate Funding, however, if any Clubs choose to make a donation to the Building Project, it would be gratefully accepted.

Our Annual Appeal will still be conducted early each year because we still need the support and donations from your Clubs to finance the acquisition and training of the dogs.
