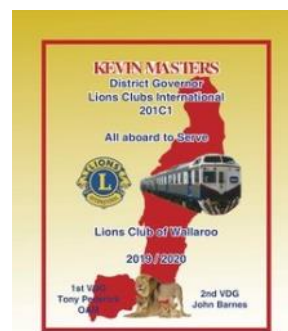

Community groups donate defib to Wallaroo Primary School

WALLAROO Primary School received an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) recently.

The Wallaroo Lions Club, Wallaroo Community Table Tennis Group and the Weerona Hotel Social Club funded the lifesaving equipment.

The AED will be located in the school gym which is frequently used by various community groups.

WPS principal Julie Petersen said it's fantastic to see the community come together to support the school.

"It is a device that can keep people safe and we really appreciate the donation," she said.

The idea was raised by the Wallaroo Community Table Tennis Group with members saving their \$2 game fees to go towards the cause.

They then reached out to the Wallaroo Lions Club and Weerona Hotel Social Club for help.

Weerona Hotel Social Club member Bronwyn Willment said it was extremely important to have a defib in a public venue.

"You never know when you'll need such equipment," she said.

"We were all happy to help to provide the school and the community groups that use the gym with the life-saving device."

Wallaroo Lions Club's Peter Fletcher said sudden cardiac arrest is the leading cause of death in Australia.

"The chance of surviving a sudden cardiac arrest increases from 10 per cent to 70 per cent when there's an AED available," he said.

"The Wallaroo Lions Club is dedicated to providing funds for local, state, interstate and national needs."

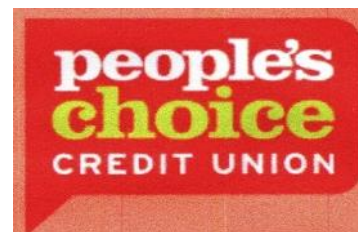

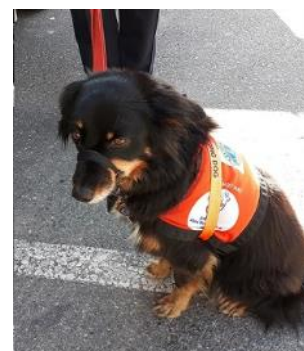

ONKAPARINGA LIONS SET NEW RECORDS IN FUNDRAISING SHED.

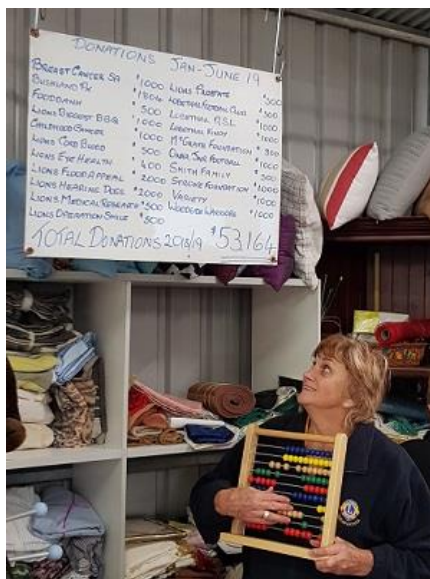
Members of the Lions Club of Onkaparinga are cockaupo over the success of their weekly Lions Shed sales which this past year have set a brand new record for fundraising.

"Each year seems to get better and better as locals get to know us, and call in to browse the aisles and shelves for new bargains," Club president Kingsley Blenkiron said.

"This year we made a record \$72,612," treasurer Sharyn Shillabeer added, "and this has helped us give out a total in donations for 2018-19 of \$53,164."

The club recorded 1,306 drop offs at the shed of donations from the public this year. Using their newly purchased ute, members also organised 270 pickups of donations and 135 deliveries for customers unable to transport their purchases.

The Shed has certainly taken the pressure off having to find other fundraising ideas, they said. And it has secondary benefits as well, not only providing locals with a social venue to meet and chat, but giving Lions members a chance to chat over a coffee at the close of the morning's trading. Regular volunteers help out as well, and some have gone on to join our ranks as Lions, Kingsley said. Other Lions members are most welcome to drop in and see them in action on Friday and Saturday mornings at the Shed, located alongside the Onkaparinga Swimming Centre in Nairne Road, Woodside.

South Australian DHS/DCSI **Working with Children Checks**

From 1 July 2019

People need a working with children check if they are in a 'prescribed position'. This means people who:

- are in paid or volunteering roles where it is reasonably foreseeable that they will work with children
- run or manage a business where the employees or volunteers work with children
- are employed to provide preschool, primary or secondary education to a child.

A working with children check assesses whether a potential employee or volunteer could pose a risk to the safety of children, based on criminal history and child protection information.

Excluded people:

You don't need a working with children check if you:
work for SA Police or the Australian Federal Police

employ or supervise children in a workplace, unless the work is child-related (e.g. you manage a fast food restaurant that employs people under 18)

work in the same capacity as a child (e.g. you work at a checkout in a supermarket that also hires people under 18 in the same type of role)

don't think you will work with children for more than seven days (consecutive or not) in a calendar year*

are a parent or guardian volunteering with your own child (e.g. at school) and do not have close personal contact with other children, or participate in an organised overnight event (e.g. a school camp)

live interstate, have a current child-related check from your home state, and are working at an organised event in South Australia lasting no more than 10 consecutive days

are under the age of 14.

The seven day exclusion does not apply if you are involved in an overnight activity (e.g. schoolcamp), or have close contact with children with disability.

The National Police Certificate is NOT a Working with Children Check.

The new checks are valid for 5 years and are continually monitored by the SA DCSI Screening Unit.

What are the transition arrangements?

- People who have a current, valid DHS/DCSI child-related employment screening will be able to keep using it until it expires. After 1 July 2019, they can apply for a WWCC up to six months before their current screening expires.

Lions Australia Child Safe Policy:

* Please note points 3 and 4 on the Lions Australia FAQ sheet could be considered contradictory. E.g. in the Youth of the Year program, a person can only judge at one event in a calendar year. Therefore one could argue that the requirements for a WWCC for judges is not required even though it is a part of the Lions Australia Child Safe policy.

If any member of your club is likely to be working closely with, or may be in a position of being alone with children or young people for more than 7 days as per the highlighted clause above, then the law will require those members to have a WWCC. Otherwise it is up to the club to decide their policy in this matter, bearing in mind the Lions Australia Child Safe Policy (available on the MD201 website) and the recommended child safe protocols in the youth program guidelines.

ENSURE NO MEMBERS ARE LEFT IN THE POSITION OF BEING ALONE WITH A CHILD. Common Sense!
