

DONATION BY MINLATON CLUB

Minlaton Lions Club Help Hearing Disability at Curramulka School.

The Minlaton Lions and Lioness Clubs received a request from the Principal of the Curramulka Primary School, Denise Rigby-Meth, to assist a hearing impaired student, aged 8 years in year 3, with a Digimaster 5000 Soundfield system.

The student, Axel, received a cochlear implant in 2018 and also uses hearing aids. The school was fortunate enough to be able to borrow a suitable sound system this year but had to return it at the end of term two.

Lions Club members Bruce Short, Robert Kidd and Tom Martin visited the student's classroom where they experienced first hand the sound system in use and could see the benefit not only for the student, Axel, but also to the teacher and fellow students in the class room. The equipment is also compatible with Axel's hearing aids and will be used by him for the remainder of his schooling at Curramulka or elsewhere.

The equipment consists of a controller including a microphone which is worn around the teacher's neck and a portable sound bar placed in the class room and able to be moved to another room if necessary. Total cost was \$2420 and the Lions Club was greatly assisted with the purchase of the equipment by a grant received from The Australian Lions Foundation Inc.

On Friday 23rd August, Lioness Margaret Button, Lions Helen Martin, Marie Meaney and Tom Martin attended the Curramulka Primary School to officially handover the equipment to Axel and the Curramulka Primary School. A thank you card was presented from the members of the class with the words "We Love It".

Modbury Lions Clubs most recent Lions Hearing Dog placement was to a profoundly deaf woman in Ingle Farm, in the north eastern suburbs of Adelaide. 'Cooper' is a Labradoodle and was chosen by Kate to be her special companion since the breed do not shed hair. Club members visited Kate and her husband Ben's home three times a week for the requisite three months to reinforce Cooper's training to react to the various sounds required for their domestic situation, and to alert Kate correctly to each test. At the end of the training period, the Head Trainer came from the Hearing Dog Training Centre at Verdun, in the Adelaide Hills to check if Cooper was sufficiently trained to react correctly, and he passed with flying colors. Kate then strapped Cooper's orange jacket on him and immediately his attitude changed from 'playful puppy' to 'proud working dog' and we went to the nearby K-Mart Shopping Centre where he again performed with distinction in the stores, and patiently waiting alongside Kate while his human friends had a coffee in a cafe. Incidentally, the very first Lions Hearing Dog trained at the Verdun facility was placed with a woman in the neighboring suburb of Para Vista in 1982.

A history of Lionism in Central Australia

Information on around 350 past and present Lions, Lioness & LEO

clubs formed in Central Australia since 1960 including District Governors, Cabinet Officers, Regions, Zones, charter

Some of this documentation relates directly to individual clubs and I will contact them individually re these matters.


