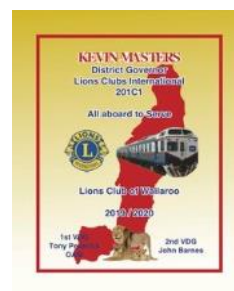

Glenside Lions have committed \$80,000 to the Burnside Men's Shed which is part of the Conyngham Street Redevelopment. This exciting new facility will redevelop an underutilised asset to integrate a variety of educational and intergenerational opportunities and social inclusion programs in a vibrant "hub-like" setting. The improved Conyngham Street site will include a new Men's Shed, Biodiversity Conservation Nursery, and Community Garden, as well as a reconfigured Council Depot. The contract for the redevelopment of the Conyngham Street Depot has now been signed and work is scheduled to commence in March 2019 and completed by November 2019.

Citizen Of the Year announced

Murray Bridge resident Shawn Hicks has been named as the Lions Club of the City of Adelaide and South Australia Police 2019 Citizen of the Year.

Mr Hicks was nominated due to his commitment to the prevention of domestic violence through education work with the local community.

Nominated by a member of the Murray Mallee Local Service Area's crime prevention team, Mr Hicks has assisted SA Police with the production and circulation of beanies which aim to support and educate the local community by promoting the message of "Say No to Domestic Violence".

The beanies have been sold and distributed in the Murray Bridge region through schools, community groups, government agencies and local businesses.

He also established a White Ribbon footy round within the local River Murray Football League, with the key awareness game being played between Mypolonga Football Club and Jervois Football Club.

It was also noted in his nomination that he is part of the 2019 working group within the Rural City of Murray Bridge "Good Neighbour Day" event for Jervois. The event is driven by the local council, SA Police, service groups and citizens to strengthen friendships, communication and reducing crime in the community.

SA Police and the Lions Club joined together today to present Mr Hicks with the award at Police Headquarters.

Nominations are made by police for the award annually in recognition of assistance provided by community members to police during the previous year.

The Lions Club of the City of Adelaide and South Australia Police Citizen's Award was first awarded in 1979, then 1983 and, after many years absence, has continued annually since 2003.

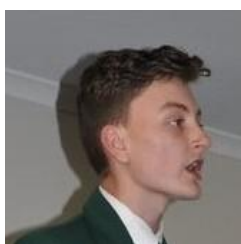

WEST BEACH LIONS CLUB CAMP QUALITY PROJECT

We welcomed guests, representing Camp Quality, Kylea Tink, representing Big 4 West Beach Parks, Narelle Hollis, Lions District C1 District Governor Kevin Masters, Federal Member for Hindmarsh Mark Butler, State Member for Colton Matt Cowley OAM, members of some of the contributing Lions clubs across District C1 and C2 and also some of the families who will get the use this facility.

I had apologies from Yvonne and Ken Bradford from ALF, Crystal Brook Community Club and Torrens Valley Lions.

This brand-new caravan and annex were a project 5 years in the making.

Our club were originally requested if we could assist in giving the existing caravan and annex at West Beach Parks a spruce up and assisting in minor repairs.

The club agreed and in 2014 we undertook an intensive cleanup of the external and internal of the caravan and annex.

I raised the idea of West Beach Lions undertaking the replacement of this setup as a local project. Whilst the idea did not look possible for a club with less than 15 members, we explored the possible solutions to updating the facility.

Funding options were explored, and West Beach Lions members agreed to go ahead with this ambitious project. During 2018, with the agreement of then District Governor for C1 Phil Bowman and DG for C2 David Snook, an approach for donations was made to the 55 Lions clubs in District C1 and the 55 Lions club in District C2, these Clubs covering South Australia, Northern Territory and part of Victoria. Some 25 Lions Clubs, one Community Club (Crystal Brook) and also Australian Lions Foundation Ltd contributed to the project.

This project is one of, if not the largest undertaken by our club, the package as presented today is valued at just over \$72,500 which includes over 200 hours of voluntary assistance by our members in getting this facility ready.

I would personally like to thank all the members of West Beach Lions Club, those Lions clubs that contributed, Australian Lions Foundation, West Beach Parks and also Camp Quality for partnering on this ambitious project.

LJ Hooker agent a real lionheart

One agent's desire to help others is inspiring a new generation to serve their local community,

Age is just a state of mind, says Michele Alexandrou, who, through her tireless service as president of the Burnside Lions Club, is breathing new life into the ageing group.

It's this commitment to her local community that saw the LJ Hooker Adelaide City/St Peters/Glynde agent take home the top prize for community service at last Saturday's awards night.

Ms Alexandrou joined the club as one of its youngest members in 2009 and, over the past two years as its president, has established its on-line presence, attracting younger members to the group.

"A girl I know, her dad just died and she's finding it hard, so I took her to the Lions Art show and she's decided she wants to join," Ms Alexandrou says. "She's 26, and there are quite a few other young ones joining as well. Our average age is about 80, so the good news is now we don't have to close the club."

Ms Alexandrou says her work for the club averages out to about 16 hours a month, but is much more at this time of the year, and that the work the group does reaches further into the local community than many would have thought.

"We have people pop into our ga-

rage sale who are dying, so we pop out and visit them and do lots of little behind-the-scenes things like that," she says. "It's really rewarding work and it brings people together. I've grown a lot as a person and developed a whole new set of skills through doing this role."

The club last year raised about \$38,000, all of which was pumped straight back into the local eastern suburbs community.

"One of the main charities we support is the Burnside Hospital because they're privately funded," Ms Alexandrou says. "We've helped build their oncology ward over the past 20 years and last year gave them a cheque for \$17,000. We also support the Burnside CFS and have built them a kitchen and bought them equipment. I just really love seeing all our hard work make such a difference in our community."

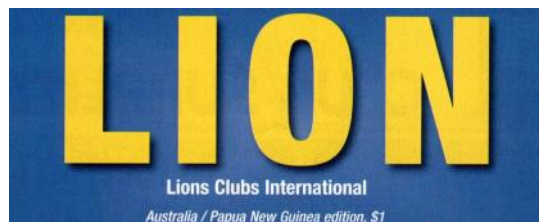
