

Sanananda Village Piggery Report October 2019

Sanananda Village Piggery was established in September of 2017, 7 pigs were purchased 2 Males and 5 females and put into the care of John Awari who is the son of the late Albert Awari Chief of the village.

Soon after this one pig ran away and another died!

Probably from stress.

This year September of 2019 I returned to Sanananda Village to check on the progress as there has been a communication problem and I have been worried sick about the project, but after talking with one of the elders Dixaford I was given information which was later confirmed when I sat and talked with John Awari.Situation is that the 5 pigs are now numbered 34 Yahoo

There has been a few used for various reasons

The education of one student

Medicines for the village malaria tablets

Running maintenance for the generators yes the old and the new one.

Clothing for the family.

The wake of an elder



All of these things were confirmed when I talked to both separately.

I also discussed the management of the baby pigs born and trading the males to another Village to protect from in breading, they have also established a new stronger pen which will be used to pen the breeding females.

I told the people in the village that I was very happy with the project and it is doing what I set out to achieve.



With the success of the piggy in the village I have had a similar request from villagers on the other side of the lagoon for help maybe in the way of a smaller piggery working on the same principals which would mean a donation of \$1000.00 to establish 2 more small ones, with the outcome from Sanananda and what it has done for the village word has spread.



My trip to the village was also an eye opener hahahahaha

Yes I took around 150 pairs of glasses to the village and with the help of a school teacher Caedmon Jr. And his sister Renee I was able to give better sight to all that received the gift of sight, for this I give thanks to Lions Gilles Plains for believing in me and the projects I dearly support.

The village can now see a brighter future.




