





It is with great sadness that I inform you of the passing of Past District Governor Lion Carlene King OAM. Carlene passed away today (4th Feb) at around 3pm at the Royal Adelaide Hospital, where she had been for a short time. Carlene is a much respected and loved member of our organisation, having served at many levels. She was our first female District Governor in 1994-95. Carlene held many positions with Lions Clubs International:-

National Manager, Youth and Community Projects, Lions Australia, 1995-2008; Coordinator, International Youth Exchange Programs, 1995-2008; Chairman, Lions Quest Youth Foundation; Life Member, Lions Clubs International, since 1987. Chairman, Lions Prostate Cancer Awareness Project, 2000-2008. Group Leader at International District Governors Elect Seminars, 2008-2009. Special Events Coordinator at 7 international conventions. Faculty Member and presenter at 8 international conventions and 11 Lions Leadership Institutes. Chairman of training school, in Sydney, for 700 incoming District Governors of Lions International, 2010. Founder, Young Leaders in Service Awards.

At a District level she is currently Global Leadership Team leader, a position she has held for several years. She achieved all of these things within Lions, and she will be remembered as a mentor and advisor. Her willingness to share experiences and knowledge has been greatly appreciated by many who crossed her path. She will be missed. Rest peacefully Carlene.



The 13 Essential Vitamins

Vitamin A helps form and maintain healthy skin, teeth, bones and soft tissue.

Vitamin C is needed for the growth and repair of tissues throughout the body.

Vitamin D helps the body absorb calcium, and is made when skin is exposed to the sun.

Vitamin E helps with the formation of red blood cells and is an antioxidant.

Vitamin K, also known as the clotting vitamin, allows the blood to coagulate.

Vitamin B1, or thiamine, helps cells convert carbohydrates into energy.

Vitamin B2, or riboflavin, works with the other B vitamins and is important for growth and the production of red blood cells.

Vitamin B3, or niacin, helps the digestive system, skin and nerves to function.

Vitamin B5, or pantothenic acid, is essential for growth and food metabolism.

Vitamin B6, or pyridoxine, helps the body make antibodies and hemoglobin, and helps maintain nerves and blood sugar.

Vitamin B7, also known as biotin, is essential for food metabolism.

Vitamin B9, known as folate or folic acid, helps with tissue growth and cell function.

Vitamin B12 helps with the formation of red blood cells and is important for metabolism.

As we move into Term 1 of another school year what better time could there be for Lions Clubs to get involved with their local kindergartens or primary schools.

The children's vision screening project supported by the Lions Eye Health Program (LEHP) is an ideal way to do just that.

Even better, this program can be delivered on either a school or community basis. Participating Lions Club members need to undertake some "online" training followed by some hands on training in the use of the testing equipment. Of course it goes without saying that holding a current working with children certificate is mandatory.

The basic concept of the program is to identify vision problems in young children as early as possible thus providing their parents or guardians with an opportunity to take steps to remedy these problems.

Children learn and participate in a wide variety of activities through their eyes. Whatever children see is normal for them however 1 in 5 will suffer from undiagnosed problems. These would include difficulties in reading or seeing a ball. If they can't read they can't learn, if they can't see a ball how can they kick or catch it. On a National basis over the last 12 months 2235 children have been screened with 422 being referred to an optician for further testing and the opportunity for living a much more fulfilling and productive life. Kids deserve that opportunity.

The screening program only takes a few minutes per child but the outcomes can be life changing for the children involved. It must be emphasised that it is screening NOT diagnostic.

Information about the program can be accessed via the lehp.org.au website or better still by inviting either of the C Districts LEHP reps, PDG Bryan Hearn, McLaren Districts LC or Lion Rob Winter, Noarlunga Morphett Vale LC to attend a club or zone meeting to explain the program in more detail and to demonstrate the testing equipment involved.
