I am looking forward to a positive and eventful year ahead, and with each of us having a lot of fun while working together in serving our communities as Lions.



A TRUE STORY

In case you didn't already know this little tidbit of wonderful trivia.....

On July 20, 1969, as commander of the Apollo 11 lunar module, Neil Armstrong was the first person to set foot on the moon. His first words after stepping on the moon, "that's one small step for man, one giant leap for mankind," were televised to earth and heard by millions. But, just before he re-entered the lander, he made the enigmatic remark "good luck, Mr. Gorsky." Many people at NASA thought it was a casual remark concerning some rival soviet cosmonaut. However, upon checking, there was no Gorski in either the Russian or American space programs.

Over the years, many people questioned Armstrong as to what the 'good luck, Mr. Gorsky' statement meant, but Armstrong always just smiled.

On July 5, 1995, in Tampa bay, Florida, while answering questions following a speech, a reporter brought up the 26-year-old question about rigors and this time he finally responded because his Mr. Gorsky had just died, so Neil Armstrong felt he could now answer the question.

His friend hit the ball, which landed in his neighbor's yard by their bedroom window. His neighbors were Mr. And Mrs. Gorsky. As he leaned down to pick up the ball, young Armstrong heard Mrs. Gorski shouting at Mr. Gorsky, "sex! You want sex?! You'll get sex when the kid next door walks on the moon!"

It broke the place up. Neil Armstrong's family confirmed that this is a true story.





Gidget has improved my socialising, and I'm now back doing something that I love - Public Speaking. She has given me so much to live for now, as I didn't have much to live for before she came into my life, I would be lost without her now. "
