
positions. He worked hard for the garage sales & encouraged younger members to participate in this club activity. A Lion who will be sadly missed by club members & his friends.

Thought I would just summarise the GST year for you with results of what has been accomplished in the area of Service as recorded on MyLion:-

- * 2,717,870 People Served against your Plan of 1,843,500
- * Total Projects completed 26,498
- * Volunteer Hours 1,005,888
- * Total Funds Donated \$4.53M across the 5 Global Causes including 78% of all donations to other local community needs
- * Number of Clubs Reporting 65%
- * 18 of 19 Districts applied for and received the USD\$500 GAT Funding simply by rendition of a "Good News Story" where the GAT had worked collaboratively for the good of the Community
- * 8 Districts submitted an entry for judging in the CA7 Top Club Service Award, with the Lions Club of Denman being adjudged Top Club Service Project for MD201, and subsequently also recognised with the CA7 Top Club Project award.
- * All Districts supported and participated in the inaugural "Lions Lap The Map for Diabetes", which has now been adopted as an annual Diabetes Service Project.

On Wednesday 15th July, Judy & Shirley are visiting the Salvation Army for a sausage sizzle and to look at their emergency service truck.





TRAUMA BEARS DONATION WHYALLA MOUNT LAURA CLUB



Whyalla Mount Laura Lions Club have given the gift of caring to Whyalla Police, donating 100 care bears to the local police station.

The bears will be used to help police officers comfort children who have experienced traumatic events such as a car accident or domestic violence.

They were made by Lions Internation-

al for local clubs to distribute around Australia as part of a long-time initiative, and this year the Whyalla Mount Laura Lions Club decided to get on board.

"We all have children, we all have grandkids, when they're put through trauma it can be very stressful for them so we thought this was a great idea," said Club President Stephen Pearce. Fellow Member Brian Marshall said the bears helped show children that police were 'there to help' in a stressful situation.

"We believe it will help calm the child down, it's going to be a very worthwhile initiative," he said.

SAPOL Operations Inspector Mark Hubbard said giving police officers the ability to 'lessen the blow' when interacting with children for the first time could change their view on police forever.

"It could be the most painful moment of their life so something as simple as giving them a teddy bear could be a game changer," he said.

"I thank the Lions Club and other service clubs like Rotary for the work they do in giving back to the community, the goodwill and generosity of the Whyalla community is fantastic."

If you would like to get on board with the Whyalla Mount Laura Lions Club to support further projects like this one, the club is in need of more volunteers.

"We really need more members, we're a club that's very high up in the age group and we need some younger members to carry it through," Mr Pearce said.

Whyalla Mount Laura Lions plan to continue the initiative next year.


Australian Lions Hearing Dogs Update

"Think globally, act locally" - I used this slogan with my discussion with all Polish Lions Clubs recently (including Polish Lion Magazine), as they are aware how to implement global concepts within a country to achieve success. As a true Lion, they may pride themselves on all the good that was being done to those who need it, all over Poland in last decade

As a most latter example I am proud to mention program of the Lions Club Gedania Gdańsk, that included help and care for homeless people and their carers in social welfare homes. As a result, 450 people received place in various shelters and dormitories for the time of crisis situation which is COVID-19 pandemic. Next 150 people are in line.

Additionally, in the absence of food and cloth supplies, Gedania faced difficult situation up and purchased underwear for over 600 people (including t-shirts, panties and socks) that was transfered to those in need. For Easter time, 450 people received festive food, along with children that are centered in 6 small orphanages all over Tri-City (Gdańsk, Sopot, Gdynia). All these gifts were financed by Lions Club Amber Gdańsk, that couldn't stand currect situation and reacted in the blink of an eye.

Furthermore, all the staff of nursing homes, including volunteers obtained masks and helmets needed to lower risks of unnecessary spreading of infection. Gedania earmarked for this purpose around 10.000 USD. The group that was organizing Lions International Board Meeting mediated in distribution of gifts from Ziaja cosmetic company (shampoos, liquid soaps, deodorants). These supplies were handed over to Elblag hospicies and shelters in Tri-City (total of over 300 pieces of cleaning materials).
