
Our Club wishes all a Merry Christmas and all the best for a safe and Happy New Year!



Presented to a student, or students, who demonstrate a worthwhile contribution to the local environment. This year, Mrs Emma Wykamp has continued to connect her Year 5/6 students with the community and local sustainability issues.

This year, the class cleared the area behind the primary school of rubbish and weeds, pruned the roses and cleared the weeds at the doctor's surgery. They volunteered to pick up rubbish and other marine industry waste on Entrance Island, including clearing the space around the old hut.

The group assisted in planting over 800 plants with the Year 7s at the wetlands. In fact, the group's final outing will be Friday, Week 9 to remove rubbish from the mangroves around town.

As a class, students studied a product and service, investigating the ways they negatively impact the environment and ways they are trying to improve, as well as providing suggestions for improvement. They studied the threats facing our oceans, such as overfishing and pollution, and explored ways that we as individuals can help at the local level.

She and her colleagues breathed a big sigh of relief to think they had teddies ready and willing to help. Happy children equal happy police officers!

Recipe from Port Augusta Lions

Ingredients

³4 cup sugar
125 grams butter
2 eggs
1 teaspoon bi-carb soda
2 tablespoons milk
2 tablespoons vanilla essence
3 ripe bananas
SR flour
salt

Method

Beat together ³/₄ cup of sugar and 125 grams of butter.

Add 2 well beaten eggs, teaspoon of bi-carb soda dissolved in 2 tablespoons of milk.

Beat up 3 ripe bananas with $\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon of salt – add to above mixture along with 1 & half cups of SR flour. Add vanilla essence.

Bake for 45 minutes at 180 degrees.
